TRI-PULLEY Yearly Report

Dear friends of Tri-pulley,

As 2024 comes to a close, we pause to reflect on the surreal journey we've shared. This year, we've faced a devastating war, regional turmoil, displacement, and relentless stress. Yet, amidst it all, we've witnessed incredible solidarity, where people and organizations stepped up to fill the gaps left by a weakened government.

The year has been hard on all of us, both in Lebanon and abroad. Even the simplest days have felt weighted by uncertainty and worry. At Tri-pulley, we've seen how meaningful work can serve as a therapeutic anchor for our team and the communities we support: "<u>Work becomes more than an income</u>, it restores purpose and hope when the world becomes overwhelming!". A team member, living near the areas under attack and working through sleepless nights, shared: "Honestly, I'm tired of trying to rest, I need to work; this makes me feel alive and fruitful," when encouraged to take a break.

Through our initiatives, we've prioritized creating opportunities that not only support livelihoods but also strengthen resilience and hope. This year, we focused on jobs empowering women, engaging youth in civic actions, and promoting eco-friendly practices while prioritizing the inclusion of people with different abilities across our actions. While schools shut down and turned into shelters, we also worked to create jobs focused on education, recreational activities, and psychosocial support to support children and help them cope with their traumatic experiences. These efforts aim to build stronger communities, even in the face of adversity.

Our team adapted to never-ending program changes to ensure we responded to emerging needs, often while being exhausted and at risk. Despite it all, we've reached an important milestone: **648 jobs** created since May 2020 (114 in 2024, 44% of which turned into long term jobs), alongside impactful "Let's Talk About Jobs" events and Games for a Social Cause with more companies using our services as part of their CSR efforts.

None of this would have been possible without your support. Thank you for standing with us through another year of challenges and solidarity.



Beneficiaries developed vital soft skills, including time and task management, communication, teamwork, emotional intelligence, public speaking, and problem-solving techniques, such as the Eisenhower Box and Divergent Thinking strategies. Special attention was given to language skills, with beneficiaries practicing French and English alongside members of the Lebanese diaspora. Our "Let's Talk About Jobs" podcasts and articles provided resources for career quidance. Many had the chance to practice interview preparation, CV writing workshops and learned strategies for leaving jobs on good terms, creating a robust support system. Those working with children with learning difficulties gained training in speech therapy and sensory techniques to overcome communication barriers. During the war, some were coached on coping with stress and creating relevant recreational activities and psycho-social support for children, addressing trauma and related challenges.



Tri-pulley has equipped beneficiaries with essential professional and technical skills. enabling them to thrive in competitive job markets. Participants have mastered Microsoft Office tools such as Excel, PowerPoint, and Word, alongside accounting, report writing, basic project management, and financial control techniques. Trainings on monitoring and evaluation. fundraising strategies, competitors and SWOT analysis prepared individuals for effective business planning and execution. Beneficiaries also gained proficiency in Google Forms, digital Adobe Premiere, and professional marketing, video editing tools, enhancing their ability to impactful social media content. create Additionally, sessions in customer service. classroom management, and environmental activities further diversified their skill sets to meet evolving industry needs.



4 Women for Tripoli

This year, Tri-pulley continued to strengthen its position as a trusted network in Beirut and Tripoli, forming meaningful connections with NGOs, businesses, and global partners. Our participation as speakers at events like "<u>4 Women for Tripoli</u>" at the Beirut Art Festival, and <u>Catalyst 2030</u> highlighted our expertise and commitment to collaboration. These opportunities allowed us to engage with diverse audiences, share our mission, and explore potential partnerships that align with our values.

NGOs increasingly placed their trust in us, understanding the profiles we needed and relying on us to support their referrals with care and efficiency. During the war, we supported their missions by enhancing their emergency human resources while staying aligned with our mandate of creating jobs.

Our <u>Social Capital Workshop</u> attracted 22 participants from diverse sectors, creating a platform to map resources, build connections, and share recommendations for collective impact. Networking events, such as those at the Australian Ambassador's residence, discussions on evaluating the war from a gender perspective with the <u>British Embassy</u>, and <u>donor field visits</u> further reinforced our role as a vital bridge between communities and stakeholders.

Our focus on peer learning led to the creation of literacy, English classes, movie clubs, and children's activity <u>WhatsApp_groups</u>, encouraging knowledge sharing among beneficiaries, in addition to <u>linking</u> <u>social enterprises</u> we support to each others. Collaborations with the Lebanese diaspora brought global insights through coaching on specialized topics, enriching local knowledge with international expertise. Events like "<u>Let's Talk About Failure</u>" provided platforms to explore conflict resolution from different perspectives, while we invited our beneficiaries and social enterprises we supported to <u>CSR events and</u> <u>markets</u> to showcase their talents to a new audience, opening doors to new opportunities.

The CFLI is a small grants program that funds local initiatives and organisations. Since its inception, the CFLI in Lebanon has supported hundreds of small-scale projects across the country. Tri-Pulley has been creating meaningful job opportunities for 75 youth and women, mainly in Tripoli. By engaging youth and women in civic events, the project also contributes to strengthening social connections and reducing community tensions in Tripoli and Beirut. Tri-Pulley has been able to implement the project in a particularly challenging context of war in Lebanon and population displacement, managing to stay on course while adapting to the new situation.



The heartbeat of home from afar:

For the Tri-Pulley diaspora team, 2024 was a year of reconnection, "*a thread of hope*," and fear for loved ones, proving that distance doesn't diminish the desire to make a difference. Through their collective efforts, these Lebanese expats turned frustration and longing into meaningful contributions, bridging the gap between their lives abroad and the challenges faced by their home country.



realities of Lebanon's struggles, The especially during times of conflict, are deeply felt even from afar. Perla, highlighted the resilience of the Tri-pulley despite the psychological and physical challenges they face daily: "Every evening, I check the <u>Tri-Pulley group chat</u> to catch up on their latest updates. I remain part of this group, even though I've been exiled from my country, as I was once a member of the team. Lately, with the horrible and tragic situation in Lebanon, part of their daily discussions looks like the screenshots I've included. ('Where are you? Airstrike in Beirut. Are you back? Stay safe. We heard a loud noise...') Then, the conversation shifts back to work related matters.

One sentence has left me breathless and haunts me to this day: #referral tahet lasef (referrals under shells). These professionals moved out of targeted locations because they fear for their lives, yet their priority remains helping others." Similarly, Yvonne expressed the emotional toll of observing Lebanon's plight from abroad: "This year has been a crazy one for Lebanon. Thankfully, Tri-Pulley was there to offer us the opportunity of meaningful contribution for our country, even from afar. I have witnessed their courage and creativity, even in the most difficult conditions, embodying the Lebanese spirit of resilience."

Beyond emotional support, the diaspora has actively contributed their skills and expertise. Eliane shared her contributions: "*I offered my skills in design to create the logo, branding, and website, helping the initiative communicate its mission with clarity and consistency.*" Yvonne, for instance, described her experience of coaching the Tri-Pulley team: "*I have had the privilege to coach team members on their leadership and communication skills. The courage of these professionals, leaving corporate careers for a mission-driven purpose, is deeply inspiring.*" Bea added: "One of the first ways *I contributed was by helping someone update their CV, offering mentorship and guidance to enhance their professional prospects. It was incredibly rewarding to witness their renewed confidence and excitement about taking the next step in their career." "Another delightful experience was recording the voiceover for Tri-Pulley's presentation video; a fun and creative process that allowed me to add my voice, literally, to their mission." In addition to these contributions, other mentorship included language conversations, Excel coaching, and Adobe Premiere training. The diaspora has also endorsed Tri-Pulley and connected it with companies like Murex, who utilized our gaming services for employee days out, significantly boosting our CSR portfolio.*

Participation in the Tri-pulley Diaspora Rally Paper has brought Lebanese abroad even closer to Lebanon. Dior described the experience as "24 hours immersed in love, energy, and the culture of our beloved Lebanon," while Marielle recounted how her Europe-based team accomplished Lebanon-inspired tasks, stating, "It was a day of laughter, learning, and hope that reminded us of the power of the Lebanese."

2024 tested us like no other year before. With tight deadlines and a war-torn environment, our team worked under immense pressure to meet donor expectations and address the urgent needs of our community.

Many of those we supported were displaced, requiring rapid and creative solutions to ensure their well being and productivity. All the while, we ourselves were victims of the conflict, *"through sleepless and frightening nights, we stood as frontliners, witnessing traumatic stories of loss and displacement, yet striving to remain pillars of support for others."*

In moments of crisis, we relied on each other. We constantly checked in to ensure <u>no one</u> was in dangerous areas, offering <u>emotional</u> and <u>professional support</u> whenever needed. Amid the turmoil, our monthly meetings became a vital anchor. Through activities like <u>children's events at schools</u> and team volunteering, we recharged our batteries.





These moments reminded us why we do what we do. As Borhan reflected, "seeing the smiles of children and their energy brought us back to the core of our mission: spreading hope, even in the darkest times" adding that "professional growth comes from pressure, finding solutions, and breaking barriers. This year, being part of the solutions made all the situation less heavy."

The workshops during our monthly meetings strengthened our professional skills. We attended sessions on <u>grant proposals</u>, communication strategies adapted to audience, walking along the Green Line with former snipers, SWOT analysis, accounting, and strategies for navigating emergencies. Charbel summarized it best: "Our monthly meetings are tailored to our needs. They've helped me become more professional in many areas of work."

Every month, we eagerly looked forward to our team-building activities, from DIY t-shirts, trying our scavenger games, secret Santa, to rally papers. Our team even evolved into an in-house advertising production crew, creating promotional videos for Tri-pulley filled with fun and bloopers.



What truly sets Tri-Pulley apart is its unparalleled team spirit. Each team member collaborates across roles, contributing their unique expertise to support the same match. This spirit of collaboration is at the heart of everything we do, driving us forward despite the challenges. "*Tri-Pulley brought out the best in me, helping me refine my skills, overcome communication barriers, and become a more confident and independent version of myself. Through my journey here, I discovered how the best employees and employers lead and act, shattering the negative stereotypes about employers often experienced within our community*" concludes Nivine.

Supporting education centers and vulnerable students

Tri-Pulley has played a crucial role in supporting education centers struggling with resource shortages by recruiting educators, allowing these institutions to continue operating and provide vulnerable students with the support they need at little to no cost. Through the employment of dedicated educators by Tri-Pulley, children at risk of dropping out due to financial constraints, child labor, or academic delays received the necessary guidance to continue their education. These classes covered a range of subjects, including Arabic, math, science, and homework support, providing a well-rounded educational foundation. These educators, equipped with coaching and activity planning support from Tri-Pulley, created an engaging and effective learning environment. As a result, students not only overcame their challenges but also successfully passed their academic year!



Online English Class

English language support

Tri-Pulley prioritized English proficiency to boost participants' professional opportunities. Online classes, led by Sirine and Abdullah, provided a flexible and engaging platform for learners to improve their communication skills, tailored specifically to help Tri-pulley's employment matches strengthen their CVs and meet job market demands; those sessions also allowed participants from different areas to virtually meet. In-person sessions by Sabrina, Oussama, Razan, and Fatima at Peace Makers, the Mina Center, and Al Jemhour club focused on practical, real-life scenarios like conversations and acting, making learning both engaging and relevant. At Wingwomen, English classes enabled women producing reusable pads to confidently engage with donors and foreign visitors, introducing themselves and their work confidently. As one participant noted, "We learned practical things we can use in our daily life."



Literacy for all: from communities to inside prisons

Tri-Pulley has dedicated significant efforts to improving literacy among marginalized communities, regardless of age, everyone should have the chance to read and write! It's never too late to start, and through our various initiatives, we have been able to bring meaningful change to many lives. At Beituna, Lea-Maria has helped transforming the literacy skills of children like Samah. Over three months, Samah progressed from learning letters to writing full sentences and is now at the same academic level as her peers, enabling her to join a formal school setting for the first time. In Mankoubin, Najah's literacy sessions have empowered children to learn to write their names, marking an important milestone in their educational journeys. Meanwhile, Cedra's sessions at Tajruba have had a profound impact on participants, including a woman who now confidently responds to phone messages, reads fluently, and navigates "internet language" more effectively.

Cedra's efforts have also benefited the mother of a child with disabilities, who expressed how much her daughter's communication and learning abilities have improved through weekly sessions. While Rima's work with street children ensures that those in vulnerable circumstances receive foundational literacy education, helping them blend into formal education and society. Additionally, Tri-Pulley's literacy programs extend into prisons, where Amita, a current prisoner employed by Tri-Pulley, teaches 15 incarcerated women. Amita's unique experience has deeply impacted both her and the women she works with, equipping them with the tools they need to reintegrate into society upon their release while allowing them to spend their time in prison in a productive way.

Innovative and Interactive Teaching Methods

Tri-Pulley insists on transforming traditional education with creative teaching approaches that integrate interactive and experiential methods. Within school support classes at Beituna, Hadil introduced techniques that addressed critical topics like emotions, bullying, and physical space. Rima's sessions with street children expanded on this approach, introducing yoga and environmentbased activities. These methods not only supported academic learning but also social skills and confidence. Building on this commitment to progressive education, Eliane was employed to explore the Nordic education model, known for prioritizing critical thinking, problem-solving, and creativity through collaborative and playful learning.

By reducing reliance on traditional testing and actively involving parents, this approach aims to prepare students as innovative thinkers and leaders. Her findings will be shared with educators in a closure event after her six-month study, offering insights to enhance teaching practices. Additionally, Tri-Pulley has focused on bridging the digital divide. We employed a specialist to provide computer literacy sessions for elderly women, enabling them to better navigate technology and stay connected with their children in today's digital world. This effort ensures they are not left behind as technology becomes increasingly important. Incorporating tech-based learning, Tri-Pulley also collaborated with MaharaTech to integrate digital tools into teaching styles.

Tri-Pulley has supported 21 inspiring women-led enterprises, many of which are addressing key social issues, such as period poverty through initiatives like Wingwomen's reusable pads and Rose pads' affordable, locally produced options. Additionally, businesses like Hanaa, concerned about the impact of excessive screen time on children focused on home education. Nouara, offering fashionable clothing for plus-size women, and Takasis, upcycling pieces of fabric into stunning accessories, highlight the diversity of solutions created by these women entrepreneurs. Rosewood Amber, а women-led enterprise operating from a rooftop, creates handcrafted soaps, empowering women to become self-reliant while contributing to the local economy.

Some women have gone on to become leaders in the fashion industry, while others, like <u>Mira</u>, transitioned from entry-level positions to floor managers, demonstrating significant career growth. Work has also been a source of empowerment for women employed by Tri-pulley **battling cancer**, as it has given them a renewed sense of control, allowing them to regain confidence and autonomy while managing their health challenges.

Self-independence workshops for

Tri-Pulley supported in advancing women's careers and promoting equal work rights. With initiatives such as <u>podcasts</u> dedicated to career orientation, women are now inspiring others globally, showing that they can succeed in the workplace and deserve equal opportunities. These efforts provide practical skills, leadership development, and the confidence to navigate a changing economic landscape.

By employing Rayan at Koudwa, we are also challenging traditional gender roles by teaching women essential skills that are typically considered men's domain, such as basic home repairs and emergency household management. These lessons promote self-dependency and allow women to break free from societal expectations, affirming their capability to handle situations that would traditionally be seen as outside their scope.

Donors' approach to supporting gender equality:

Tri-Pulley's commitment to gender equality was strengthened by the support of the **Dorria Feminist Funds**, which allowed us to focus more on gender issues under their guidance. The **CFLI gender analysis** helped us understand the importance of offering flexible working hours and supporting home-based businesses, ensuring that women facing unique challenges have the opportunity to work from home or adjust their schedules. These insights have shaped our project design, enabling us to better address the needs of marginalized women, including those with caregiving responsibilities, and to ensure that work opportunities are accessible to all women, regardless of their circumstances.





Well-being through sports and community activities

Tri-Pulley is dedicated to enhancing women's well-being by addressing their challenges through yoga, sports, self-care, and creative expression. Diana's yoga sessions provide tools for relaxation and stress relief while creating a supportive community for women facing daily struggles. Aya, a nursing student specializing in pediatric and pregnancy care, supports pregnant women, especially those displaced, by equipping them with stress management techniques and essential health awareness.





In Mankoubin, <u>Sanaa</u> leads life skills sessions where women of all ages find psychological relief and build a sense of belonging through sports, transforming physical activity into a meaningful part of their lives. Amani and Farah further this mission through football sessions that instill teamwork, leadership, and selfconfidence among girls, while young <u>girls also</u> <u>participate in ping-pong</u> classes in Tripoli.

Jana was recruited as a content creator for Coach Zeinab's Instagram page, an influencer dedicated to promoting <u>sports for women</u>. In her role, Jana highlights accessible ways for women to stay active and promotes inclusivity in fitness.

Creative and emotional well-being initiatives complement these physical activities. Abdelrahim's music sessions at RDFL provide women with an artistic outlet, creating a therapeutic and joyful space for self-expression. At Rifak El Darb, elderly women enjoy <u>nail-painting sessions</u>, affirming the importance of self-care and dignity at every age. Meanwhile, Georgette works closely with women in the Nabaa neglected community, offering a compassionate listening ear and emotional support during her regular home visits, helping women feel connected to a caring network during difficult times.

Diverse Job Opportunities

Tri-pulley connected People with physical and intellectual disabilities with a wide variety of roles tailored to their skills and aspirations. Success stories include Naim, who shines as a public figure and waiter at Agonista, and Rana, a passionate book lover who worked as a librarian assistant at Assabil. Other roles filled by PWD include IT specialists, kitchen staff, content creators, graphic designers and sign language teachers, with Jinane teaching the Red Cross, among others. These roles, supported by tailored mentorship, helped individuals gain meaningful skills, often leading to long-term employment. These talented individuals were referred to Tri-pulley by academic institutions like AUST and UPT bridging the gaps between education and employment.

Cedra's literacy classes for an autistic child and Rawan's football matches for blind children, empower beneficiaries in unique ways. Additionally, supporting organizations like the Right Road and FISTA with employment help them fulfill their mission of educating people with disabilities.


Job coaching: Supporting integration

Job coaching has been a critical element in Tri-pulley's success. Coaches like Lea and Karen were employed to provide tailored guidance to PWD at their workplace, ensuring a smooth transition into the workforce. For example, at Totally Kids Kindergarten, job coach Paula worked closely with Nour, helping her improve professional skills such as communication and spontaneous initiatives. This support not only enhances PWD's performance but also alleviates concerns from employers.

Impact on employers & Culture shift

Tri-pulley aims at transforming workplace culture to be more inclusive and accepting of people with disabilities. For instance, <u>Nour's exceptional precision</u> and organizational skills, demonstrated during her tenure at Per Tutti, not only impressed her colleagues but also inspired a cultural shift in the organization. The restaurant owner, recognizing the value PWD bring to the workforce, has since committed to hiring more PWD across their branches. Similarly, <u>Elissa</u>, a former beneficiary of SESOBEL, now serves as Tri-pulley's official photographer, capturing major events such as the Murex outdoor event. Her work highlights the immense potential of PWD when they are given opportunities to thrive.

In our Corporate Social Responsibility events, Tri-pulley ensure that companies' employees engage directly with PWD: Activities such as a sign language session led by Jinan, in addition to gifting sign language sessions to the winners of competitions, create meaningful connections, value, and awareness.

Tri-pulley has also been actively involved in policy discussions, such as the one organized by Arcenciel, which focused on comprehensive policies for employing PWD. Additionally, Tri-pulley collaborated with COSV to design an engaging <u>game</u> aimed at promoting inclusivity practices within the workplace. Several companies, including Pizza Hut, Bossa Nova, Per Tutti, Riders Rights, <u>Agonista</u>, Thaki, HDF, Totally Kids Kindergarten and Assabil, have partnered with us this year to employ PWD. These organizations are setting a powerful example by addressing challenges such as workplace bullying through respect and teamwork.

Jobs and skills building that improves political engagement

Recognizing that unemployment hinders the ability of individuals to realize their potential and to freely participate in their community, Tri-pulley empowered youth, women, and marginalized groups to become agents of change by integrating them in the job market, particularly in civic action roles. This approach built resilience, reduced economic vulnerability, and enhanced skills, self-confidence, and social networks, boosting their exposure, strengthening communication, leadership, and conflict-resolution capabilities, and cultivating a sense of civic responsibility. Indirectly, those skills created engaged citizens more ready to hold public officials accountable, demand fairness, and advocate for transparency. Economic independence reduced reliance on patronage systems, transforming young people into informed citizens who critically scrutinized government actions.



Through the support of the <u>Canadian Fund for Local Initiatives</u>, <u>Tri-pulley</u> <u>facilitated</u> 75 temporary jobs that demonstrated how work drives political and civic involvement.





Adaptation during war

During conflict, Tri-pulley demonstrated the power of adaptation to new and challenging contexts. We raced to support internally displaced individuals in improvised shelters by creating employment opportunities that directly addressed this need. Redesigned shelters under <u>D4C</u> provided both physical safety and emotional relief by transforming cramped, bleak spaces into comforting environments. For children, play and <u>singing</u> became a shield against the harsh realities of war facilitated by Hadil and Amina, as one child poignantly remarked, "<u>Let's play so we</u> <u>don't hear the sounds of bombs</u>."

Psychosocial support activities, such as Diana's <u>yoga</u> sessions, Esraa's <u>storytelling</u> initiatives, Razan's <u>movies</u>, Ibrahim's <u>theatre</u>, Fatima's online <u>book club</u>, and Ataa's <u>board games</u> helped communities cope emotionally and socially. Self-defense training, led by Ghinwa, empowered displaced children, providing a sense of agency in a world of violence. Anna-Maria also visited mothers in their homes, providing a space for them to vent and reveal their internal battles, which helped them become more efficient and present in their children's lives.

In addition, Tri-pulley supported <u>Wingwomen</u> with Mariam producing reusable pads that were distributed to IDPs. The organization also backed community kitchens like <u>Utopia</u> <u>Kitchen</u> and <u>Zmrd</u>, which not only provided sustenance but also challenged stereotypes about Tripoli as a welcoming city. These kitchens proved that shared meals could build connections even during divided times. The distribution of Tripolitan soaps to IDPs, accompanied by a warming, welcoming message, further supported the women-led initiative, <u>Rosewood amber</u>, reinforcing this sense of solidarity.





Creating healthy spaces for mixing and exchange

Inclusive spaces drive dialogue, learning, and the cultivation of civic habits. Aisha's Karantina reclaimed public garden sessions taught children to care for nature, support one another, and prevent bullying. Ramzi's movie screenings in Mankoubin sparked excitement among kids who had never been to the cinema, bringing the community together in a challenged area. Djullanare spread positivity with interactive art at Corniche El Mina, where people made uplifting messages and flowers for each other and smiled as they saw themselves in the mirror, transforming public spaces into creative hubs. Ataa's board games encouraged children to engage without phones, aiming to improve family connections. Esraa's storytelling sessions helped children express themselves on a variety of social and environmental topics through drawing and discussion. Fatima's book club engaged youth in meaningful discussions and exchanges. Meanwhile, Tripulley's "Let's Talk About Failure" events focused on unsafe migration, allowing communities to discuss what drives them to leave the country, the failed support systems, and potential less risky alternatives.

Sports and activities as a means to civic action

Sports and recreational activities built teamwork, self-confidence, and community spirit, essential elements of civic engagement. Football sessions for kids, adults, and women addressed health issues like smoking while teaching valuable life skills. Ezzat's ping pong program broke stereotypes by encouraging girls to actively participate in sports, while chess classes focused on strategic thinking and anticipation. Fair play and learning how to lose were at the core of these activities, demonstrating how competitions and sports can break barriers and promote inclusivity.



Peace building

Peacebuilding initiatives have bridged divides and built dialogue across diverse communities. Through creative methods like theater, games, and interfaith discussions, Tri-pulley has supported meaningful initiatives with jobs that inspire empathy and reconciliation. Notable examples include <u>Truebless</u>'s inter-religious communication workshops and <u>Peace Makers'</u> PSS initiatives. We also invited Fighters for Peace and Laban Theatre for a <u>conflict resolution game</u> that challenged us to confront how emotions, manipulation, and biases can divide us. Our team walked along the <u>Green Line with a former sniper</u> to better understand the civil war and ensure history doesn't repeat itself, while we are finalizing a game for the public with Mohamed to address this issue further. A <u>youth camp</u> entitled "Nature's way: Detox and solutions through simplicity" engaged participants in activities that taught them the value of resourcefulness and seeking help from others. We also supported YARD's campaigns, raising awareness about drugs and <u>stray bullets</u>, and showcased the impact of <u>Maan</u> with Edward's <u>research</u> and support for <u>Beirut explosion</u> victims, along with youth activism in the political sphere.






Conflict resolution game

Reaching the most vulnerable

Tri-pulley's commitment to supporting marginalized communities ensures that no one is left behind. Tailored interventions address the unique needs of women, children, the elderly, internally displaced persons, prisoners, and ex-detainees during times of crisis. In partnership with Seha wo Masseha, Tri-pulley helped distribute blankets and food to elderly living alone. <u>Even in prison</u>, we believe that opportunities for growth and change can be created. Amita (chosen name), a current detainee, was hired to teach literacy classes to fellow women inmates. <u>Ali, an exprisoner</u>, now uses his passion for sports to support his local football team at Mankoubin Stadium. By leading chants and energizing the crowd, Ali is redefining his role and transforming perceptions, showing that even those with a troubled past can create unity in their communities.

By providing these businesses with skilled human resources, Tri-pulley enhances their operations and creates valuable job opportunities, equipping individuals with essential skills and work experience. This approach ensures mutual benefits: businesses thrive with the right talent, gain a trial period without economic burden, and increase their probability of employee retention, while workers secure meaningful employment that strengthens their career paths.




In the environmental sector, businesses such as <u>Annineh Fadieh</u>, <u>Takassis</u>, <u>Bele Town</u>, and <u>Zap</u> <u>Idea</u> focus on upcycling materials into valuable products, promoting waste reduction and sustainable production. In the hospitality and inclusion sector, <u>Agonista Café</u>, <u>Zmrd</u>, and <u>Quad</u> <u>Academy Coffee</u> provide inclusive job opportunities, particularly for individuals with disabilities. Meanwhile, women-led businesses like <u>Nouara</u> (fashion) and <u>Rosewood Amber</u> (traditional soapmaking) empower female entrepreneurs and expand economic participation.

Other social enterprises, such as <u>Beit El Mina</u>, which channels its restaurant proceeds toward scholarships, and <u>Fangarawi</u>, which revives traditional artisanal crafts, along with <u>Rumman</u> and <u>Marsah</u> highlight the intersection of cultural preservation and economic sustainability.

Additionally, businesses driving social engagement and well-being have seen a direct impact. <u>Heart</u> <u>Defender</u> works on health innovations, while <u>Multiverse</u> and <u>Aura</u> use board games to build connections. Through Tri-pulley, individuals like <u>Mira</u> and <u>Nairn</u> have found stable employment, continuing in the workplace beyond the six-month Tri-pulley support, contributing to business growth and enhancing their own skills and financial security.

Supporting environmental enterprises and awareness with 176 beneficiaries

Environmental awareness

Tri-pulley's commitment to increasing environmental awareness is evident through diverse community-driven initiatives and job creation. Ibrahim's environmental awareness sessions at Hemma engaged children with hands-on activities, teaching them the importance of sustainable practices from a young age. Similarly, a six-day workshop and events in Kfarhelda, commissioned by Injaz, introduced local residents and IDPs to the "6R" principles and circular economy.





These workshops bridged communities that had little interaction, blending education with actionable steps toward sustainability and fun. Mahdi contributed by creating and cleaning green spaces, planting flowers, and beautifying neglected areas around the Tajrouba center. His efforts not only provided a greener environment but also gave him a personal sense of purpose, steering him away from harmful influences and inspiring children to appreciate nature.

Supporting Social and Environmental Enterprises

Tri-pulley supported social and environmental enterprises by providing human resources to champion sustainability. <u>Takassis</u> created fashionable items from fabric waste, while <u>Annineh Fadieh</u> transformed glass bottles into cups and reusable items, giving waste a new life. <u>Wingwomen</u> tackled waste management and period poverty by producing reusable pads and diapers, economically empowering women in its production process.





Zap Idea gave a second life to discarded wood, creating practical and fashionable furniture. <u>Beleh</u> <u>Town</u> collected pre-loved clothing and made them available for purchase in various markets, promoting affordable and sustainable fashion choices. Meanwhile, <u>FANQARAWI</u> decorated homes with handmade items inspired by simple, eco-friendly village life, offering an escape from the pollution and chaos of urban environments.



Sustainable Transportation

Recognizing the critical role of eco-friendly transit in reducing carbon emissions, Tri-pulley partnered with initiatives such as Riders' Rights, Tripoline, and Ville Velo. These programs advocated for sustainable transportation solutions. <u>Ville Velo</u> promoted cycling as a delivery option in Beirut, pushing for bike-friendly infrastructure and safety measures. <u>Tripoline</u> emphasized the importance of safe and affordable bus transportation in Tripoli, while <u>Riders' Rights</u> focused on mobility justice, ensuring fair and equitable transportation options for all. Together, these initiatives encouraged individuals to adopt greener mobility solutions towards a cultural shift of sustainable urban commuting.

Accessibility to culture

Tri-pulley is committed to making arts and culture accessible while preserving Lebanese heritage. The Tripoli Archaeology Club, which highlights the city's rich history through <u>guided tours</u>, is a shining example of this effort. Zahra, a young translator, was hired to make the club's content accessible to diverse audiences by translating it into multiple languages, helping to spread Tripoli's story globally.

<u>TourLeb</u> has been our partner in promoting our <u>outdoor escape rooms</u> within their

<u>tours;</u> a fun way to discover Tripoli while playing!





To make historical education more engaging for children, Rima, a graphic designer and painter inspired by archeology, proposed creative ideas, such as introducing coloring books based on the sites visited, creating an interactive learning experience for kids. Additionally, the employment of Imane as a content creator helped amplify <u>Tripoli's local</u> <u>platform</u>, showcasing local talents, events, tastes, and spaces preserving the city's vibrant identity known best by its locals.

Supporting cultural NGOs and events

To promote and sustain arts and culture, Tri-pulley provides human resources to key organizations driving cultural transformation in Tripoli and Beirut. Both <u>Rumman</u> and <u>Marsah</u>, initiatives supported by Tri-pulley, host music, exhibitions, movies, and theater in stunning rehabilitated venues, celebrating the city's creative potential. These hubs for arts and knowledge offer young people a safe and inspiring space to explore their talents. Organizations like <u>Seenaryo</u>, known for its inclusive storytelling and theater programs, and <u>Sada Playback Theatre</u>, which brings participatory performances to life, have also received support from Tri-pulley.





Arts and Culture as therapy and daily routine

Tri-pulley recognizes the therapeutic power of arts and culture, offering healing and social cohesion through creative initiatives. Cirenciel employed teachers bring <u>circus arts</u> to children, inspiring teamwork and confidence, while Djullanar transformed ugly public walls into expressive <u>street art</u>, enhancing urban spaces. Ibrahim's <u>puppet shows</u> and art therapy sessions brought joy to children, and <u>Fatima's Book Club</u> encouraged literary discussions for intellectual growth and community building. In Gemmayze, <u>Waed's street art sessions</u> engaged disadvantaged youth, offering them a creative outlet. <u>Music sessions</u> led by Abdulrahman at RDFL empowered women to discover their voices and pursue professional training, while the various movie clubs have built opportunities for dialogue. These initiatives strengthened community bonds, weaving arts and culture into the fabric of everyday life.

Empowering children through play and awareness

Tri-pulley's PSS initiatives focus on nurturing children's emotional and social well-being. Sara, in partnership with Himaya, led sessions at Tajruba to raise awareness about child rights and abuse prevention. Nancy, a psychologist, provided children with safe spaces to express themselves and process emotions and <u>PTSD</u> after the war through storytelling, while equipping parents with tools to help their children overcome this challenging phase. Amina, a talented educator from Chatila, conducted engaging activities for schoolchildren to boost creativity and reduce the <u>stress caused by war</u> in their neighborhoods. Sessions encouraging children to release negative energy creatively through art therapy for street children, theater therapy, <u>circus</u>, and sports further showcased the transformative power of play. By supporting NGOs such as Nour El Aalm and Himaya with human resources, we ensured they could sustain the delivery of impactful workshops and activities for children





Strengthening women and families

The resilience of women and families was enhanced through tailored support sessions. Anna-Maria, a sociology student, was employed to provide PSS activities for women and parents at IDP centers in Sin el Fil. Diana's <u>yoga sessions</u> helped participants manage stress, while art therapy provided a calming outlet amidst challenging circumstances. Sanaa and her initiative, dedicated to <u>women's sports</u>, highlighted the importance of safe spaces for physical activity. These programs not only improved participants' physical health but also encouraged teamwork and self-confidence. Beyond physical activities, attention to holistic care for vulnerable groups played a vital role. Mariane's <u>nail care sessions for the elderly</u> offered companionship and dignity to those often isolated.

Creative platforms for emotional expression at work

Innovative approaches such as <u>podcasts</u> and interactive workshops explored the connection between psychosocial support and <u>work</u>, offering valuable insights to adults on how to overcome stress during the war and stay <u>productive</u> and focused. While for Tri-pulley team, volunteering and spending time with displaced kids and families helped us <u>recharge our batteries</u>!
